The BA in English focuses on critical reading and analysis, effective writing for numerous audience and purposes, cultural and media studies, and rhetoric and linguistics. The major fosters skills in reading and interpretation; professionalization, including a required capstone internship; understanding diverse cultures and discursive contexts; and working with numerous traditional and multi-modal writing technologies. The major prepares students for any career involving strong communication skills, but especially law, publishing and editing, higher education, and academics, lobbying and publicist work, and writing in numerous professional applications.

Note that all students much achieve 120 undergraduate credits and a minimum 2.0 overall GPA to graduate. The final GPA requirement for English is 2.0
