B.A. Political Science Paralegal Studies Requirements

The major in Political Science emphasizes analytical and writing skills together with developing knowledge of the U.S. government, global political systems, and the means of inquiry in the social sciences. The major prepares students for graduate work and for a broad range of careers including administrative positions in government, community organizations, electoral politics, or organizations working on behalf of specific policies. Graduates often pursue careers in business, law, consulting, state, local, and federal government, journalism and communications, international organization, finance, polling and campaign management, community service, and non-governmental organizations (NGOs).

The Political Science major with Paralegal Studies offers students a chance to simultaneously obtain a BA degree in Political Science and to complete Lehigh Carbon Community College's (LCCC) American Bar Association-approved Paralegal Studies Certificate which focuses on the paralegal profession and the limitations imposed by the unauthorized practice of law.

Note that all students must achieve 120 undergraduate credits and a minimum 2.0 overall GPA to graduate. The final GPA requirement for Political Science Paralegal Studies is 2.0.
