The Bachelor of Fine Arts in Art hones student skills across a wide range of approaches and media, from traditional to digital. Following a foundational year studying drawing, design, and art history, students explore a variety of artistic practices before concentrating in their chosen medium. Art specializations include ceramics, drawing, painting, photography, printmaking, sculpture, and textiles.

## Student Learning Objectives:

- 2. Develop knowledge of art history.
- 3. Demonstrate technical proficiency in the production of art.
