The Secondary Education Department offers a master's degree in Curriculum and Instruction. The program consists of coursework, and a student will submit an electronic portfolio at the end of the program for review. All requirements for this program should be completed within six calendar years.

Note that all students much achieve a minimum of 30 graduate credits and a minimum 3.0 overall GPA to graduate.
