M.Ed. in Secondary Education: Teaching with Initial Certification Requirements

The M.Ed. in Secondary Education: Teaching with Initial Certification consists of a minimum of 36 semester hours of coursework, including clinical experience. All courses are three semester hours with the exception of the Intensive Clinical Experience. This program is designed to accelerate teacher certification for students who have already demonstrated content mastery. A student can earn a master's degree simultaneously with teaching certification. KU offers 7-12 teaching certification in the following areas: Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Earth and Space Science, General Science, Mathematics, Mathematics and Physics, English, and Social Studies. The K-12 teaching certification areas include Spanish and German. Consult with the Secondary Education Department Chair about the certification requirements that you will need to fulfill.

Note that all students much achieve 36 graduate credits and a minimum 3.0 overall GPA to graduate.

Program Structure and Field Component

Students progress through the program as a cohort group starting course work in the summer semester. Course work continues through the following fall and winter semesters and is completed in the spring by taking two accelerated courses and the 14-week clinical experience in either the Allentown or Reading School District.

Students will complete early field experience. These field experiences will be documented and analyzed in the course EDU 532 Education Exploration as a prerequisite for the capstone clinical experience.

General Admission Requirements

- Passing score for Praxis II Subject Assessment test in the content area sent to Kutztown University.
- Earned bachelor's degree (GPA) of 3.0 in area of certification or related area or evidence of achievement of a 3.0 post-bachelor's GPA (minimum of four content area courses)
- Completion of graduate entrance requirements.
- Appropriate clearances sent to Graduate Admissions.
- Successful interview with Department of Secondary Education.

Additional Requirements for Certification/Graduation

Candidates seeking program completion and certification must satisfy all curriculum requirements, all University requirements, and fulfill the following:

- Passing score for Praxis II Subject Assessment test in the content area. Foreign Language certification also requires the Praxis II Fundamental Subjects Assessment.
- 3.0 GPA maintained throughout the program.
- Complete appropriate certification/graduate paperwork to process certification/graduate degree
