



Master of Public Administration Criminal Justice Requirements

From violent crime to public order offenses, the Master of Public Administration with a concentration in Criminal Justice focuses on applied problem-solving skills. Through course work and an emphasis on student research, students receive specialized knowledge and technical skills in budgeting, planning, personnel administration, legal issues in criminal justice, police strategies, and social policymaking.

Note that all students must achieve 36 graduate credits and a minimum 3.0 overall GPA to graduate. Undergraduate admissions to the BA/MPA accelerated program require junior status (60 or more credits), at least 24 POLI course credits, 3.0 GPA or higher, and positive recommendation from the department chairperson and MPA coordinator.
