The minor in Public Administration emphasizes skill development that prepares students for employment in the public and non-profit sectors. Coursework focuses on public planning and decision-making, including public budgeting and human resource management. The Public Administration minor includes a 6- or 12-credit government internship, providing students with a pathway for careers in state, local, and federal government, business, law, consulting, finance, community service and non-governmental organizations (NGOs).

Program requirements: 21 credits. The final GPA requirement for Public Administration minor is 2.0. Students must maintain a minimum 2.0 GPA in minor courses.
