# Case Management Minor Requirements

The Case Management Minor, based on the planned change model of practice, provides the opportunity for: personal growth and development; practical hands-on assignments; real-life examples; career enhancement for the helping professional. The minor is designed to assist students majoring in Communication Studies, Criminal Justice, Education, Professional Studies, Psychology, Social Work, Sociology and/or embarking on a career as a helping professional.

Program requirements: 18 credits. The final GPA requirement for Case Management Minor is 2.00. Courses with an asterisk have restrictions; see notes below.
