

Instructional Technology Specialist Certification Requirements

The Instructional Technology Specialist Certification Program provides course preparation in education and includes a comprehensive portfolio. The program leads to a certification.

Note that all students must achieve 24 - 36 graduate credits and a minimum 3.0 overall GPA to receive certification depending on prior course. Students will work with their advisor to determine the need to take adaptations and accommodations and/or English language learner requirements.
